LAKE ASSOCIATION PREPARING FOR 2017

Board members and volunteers are busy preparing for the Lake Francis Area Recreation & Conservation Club's annual events and activities.

"We continue to build a stronger organization year after year," Association President Jan Anderson said. "We're committed to doing all we can to prevent aquatic invasive species like Zebra Mussels and Starry Stonewart from entering Lake Francis, but we're also planning fun events that bring neighbors together."

Meeker County will provide AIS inspections at the main Lake Francis boat launch on weekends from Memorial Day to Labor Day this year. The LFARCC will continue to monitor the Township launch on high traffic weekends. Area lakes are considering pilot programs for a more aggressive inspection program. The Board will discuss this at their April meeting.

In addition to boat launch monitoring, volunteers around the lake have placed Zebra Mussel detectors near their docks and volunteers visually inspect for other invasive species during the year.

The LFARCC will also continue its work in key areas like water quality and recreation, too. The CROW released a water quality study in late 2016. The Board plans to review the results in the near future and possibly invite a representative from CROW to speak at the Annual Meeting in June. The annual Eagle Creek clean-out will be a hot topic in the coming months as the Board looks for solutions to possible clean-out costs in 2017.

Lake residents will soon be able to enjoy a Lake Francis aerial map being produced by area realtor and business member Steve Bruggeman.

LAKE ASSOCIATION LAUNCHES NEW WEBSITE

The LFARCC launched a new website in early 2017. The site features a vibrant new design and content to help members and residents stay up-to-date on lake news and events.





I'd like to welcome all of our new cabin owners to Lake Francis—we're glad you're here! Please feel free to contact your area representatives if you have questions regarding the lake or surrounding area. And don't forget to pick up one of our New Member Packets from Board Member John Stokes!

If you haven't already joined the Lake Association, please do! Our organization represents members on the issues most important to them. LFARCC volunteers are working hard on conservation, water quality, invasive species and we're always looking for new ideas and talented members to join us.

One of the greatest concerns of our members is the potential for Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) to infest Lake Francis. So far we've remained free of Eurasian Milfoil, Zebra Mussels and Starry Stonewart; however, all of those invasive species have been discovered in nearby lakes. The LFARCC will continue to work closely with the DNR, local officials and nearby lake associations to keep members up-to-date on AIS issues and treatments.

Again this year, the main Lake Francis boat launch will be monitored by trained AIS inspectors from Anchor Dock & Lift and Bishop AIS Services from May to September. Boats will be inspected for invasive species and boaters educated in identifying invasive species and how to properly clean their boats.

Trained AIS volunteers from our organization also perform monthly AIS weed and Zebra Mussel inspections of all nine areas of the lake. We also ask you to be on the

lookout for any suspicious invasive species. If you see what you suspect may be an AIS, please contact your area representative so we can have it checked out.

Please join us on June 24 for the Lake Association's Annual Meeting held at the Kingston Community Center. Board members and special guests will share updates on association projects and issues that effect Lake Francis.

I'm very excited to announce that the LFARCC will once-again host the annual picnic, which will be held on Saturday, August 5. Our 2nd Annual Golf Outing will be the next day—Sunday, August 6. Last year over 25 people enjoyed a round of golf at the Kimball Golf Course to raise funds for the LFARCC.

contribute to the effort of keeping invasive species out of the Lake. Based on all the bad things that could get into the lake, I believe this is the most important thing the Association should continue to work for.


What do you enjoy most about Lake Francis?

LAKE FRANCIS AIS MONITORING SUCCESSFUL IN 2016

Monitors make 823 inspections, educate boaters

When Lake Francis teamed with the CROW and charged Bishop AIS Services with the 2016 AIS monitoring initiative on Lake Francis, we set two goals for our program.

First and foremost, we endeavored to educate users and boaters of Lake Francis of the seriousness of AIS and, specifically, Zebra Mussels. The second goal of the program was to reduce the chance of AIS introduction to Lake Francis.

Both goals were driven by inspections at the access. In our efforts to educate boaters, hundreds of regular users of Lake Francis that had no knowledge of the concern now appreciate the seriousness of the issue and understand the mantra from the DNR "clean, drain and dry" as well as the options they have to comply with either best practices or a complete decontamination. We \taught boaters that this matter is simultaneously important, eminent and actionable.

In our efforts to reduce the change of AIS introduction, it was understood that 24/7 inspection coverage is untenable given the funding so we would utilize a "best effort" approach.

Based on predicted boater traffic, we generated an inspection staffing

schedule that tried to maximize the number of boats that would be inspected. To my knowledge, no AIS was introduced to Lake Francis in 2016.

In summary, we succeeded in both goals of the 2016 AIS monitoring initiative on Lake Francis. In addition to our goals, as part of the delegation agreement between the DNR and CROW, our monitors collected a significant amount of data about traffic totals, traffic patterns, violations of DNR rules and best practices found at the Lake Francis access. The data was gathered by our monitors using the DNR software and is available for public review via the DNR.

Despite our successes, in 2016 we received extremely disheartening news about your closest neighbor to the northeast, Lake Sylvia. In June 2016, it was confirmed that Lake Sylvia contains Zebra Mussels. Then in September, the DNR confirmed the presence of Starry Stonewort. In my opinion, these both present a clear and present danger to the health and quality of Lake Francis, as well as all lakes in the area.

To my knowledge, there are no known "silver bullet" solutions for treatment or containment of either of continued on next page...

these threats to our lakes. The
biology of Zebra Mussels are fairly
well understood in terms of their
lifecycle, ways to inhibit their spread,
and means to decontaminate marine
equipment. Unfortunately the same
information about Starry Stonewort is
not yet available. Based on anecdotal
evidence, Starry Stonewort may be
even more detrimental to lakes than
Zebra Mussels.

I would urge anyone with an interest in the health and quality of Minnesota lakes (and I would argue that includes everyone because the economy of Minnesota is significantly affected by our lakes) become educated and proactive at the




