# **Greetings from LFARCC President Craig Panning**

The LFARCC is only successful with Lake Area Resident and Business support.



### **Lake Francis 2021 Water Level**

10 Year History Provided by Minnesota DNR www.dnr.state.mn.us



If you're interest in the History of water levels on Lake Francis, you might find this information interesting. The red line on the graph above represents the Ordinary High Water Level for Lake Francis. That elevation is 1048.6 ft. The most recent water level was measured on April 15, 2021. That level was 1047.83 ft.

Water levels since 1954 had a 4.95 ft. range. Highest level recorded was 1049.81 ft. on August 30, 2002. Lowest level recorded was 1044.86 ft. on May 3, 1990. The blue line on the graph indicates the water level has been on a lower projection since middle of 2019.

According to the National Weather Service, Annandale, MN. averages 30 in. of rain and 43 in. of snow annually.

### AIS WATCH EFFORTS CONTINUE

COVID-19 didn't deter the LFARCC's continued efforts to control (Aquatic Invasive Species) on our lake. One of the main responsibilities of The LFARCC is to monitor and deter the spread of AIS on our lake. All LFARCC members contribute financially to the AIS Reserve Fund through a portion of annual dues. 2020 member contribution was \$4050. (Fund Balance is \$91,085).

Brian Knox, Hidden Forest, AIS Coordinator and his team of volunteers continue monitoring our lake for signs of any type of AIS. Brian reports the only invasive found in our lake is Curly Leaf Pondweed.

Lake Francis will again be part of the 2021 Meeker County Watercraft Inspection Program. Coordinated by Ariana Richardson, Meeker County AIS Coordinator, this program provides a watercraft inspector at our main boat launch site from mid May through early Sept. Hours of inspections are primarily weekends. Inspectors attempt to minimize spread of AIS from lake to lake by inspecting watercraft in and out of Lake Francis. In 2020, the program inspectors completed 927 inspections, with a majority, 76% of inspections conducted on fishing boats. Owners of 69% of all watercraft inspected indicated their boat had been out of the water for 5 days. (DNR recommended time for AIS weeds attached to trailer or watercraft to dry and not spread.)

### WATER QUALITY-HOLDING STEADY

Brian Knox reports the water quality of Lake Francis is holding steady over recent years. Brian samples and has lake water tested annually. If you are interested in 14 years of water quality analysis check out the following web site www.rmbel.info/data.

# **TREASURER'S UPDATE:** report submitted April 25, 2021 by Mike Oesterrich, LFARCC Treasurer

Total 2020 LFARCC income was \$10,645. That was down \$1,214 from 2019.

Major income sources included: Membership Dues \$6,075., Business Memberships \$1,400., Member Donation \$1,620., Interest Income \$1,350. 2020 income declines included: Golf Outing fundraiser \$1,330., Picnic donation \$400.

The total 2020 LFARCC expenses were \$8,793. That was down \$2,493. from 2019.

Major expenses included: AIS Reserves \$6,300., (\$4050. from membership dues, and \$2,250 LFARCC Board approved from excess income), Newsletter \$1,001., Insurance \$653., Web Expense \$361. and Water Sampling \$285.

LFARCC reserves increased by \$7,650 to a total of \$91,085. This is split \$82,285 For AIS Reserves and \$8,800 for Conservation Reserves. The AIS Reserves will allow the board to react quickly to address any future AIS issues should it be determined treatment or preventative action is needed. The Conservation Reserves are held for any project to improve water quality. Mike reports the LFRCC ended 2020 with \$3,459. in the checking account.
